## **Product Description**

Recombinant human DGKB (11-end) was expressed by baculovirus in Sf9 insect cells using an N-terminal His tag. The gene accession number is <u>NM 004080</u>.

## Formulation

Recombinant protein stored in 50mM Tris-HCl, pH 7.5, 300mM NaCl, 200mM imidazole, 1mM DTT, 10% glycerol.

## **Storage and Stability**

Store product at -70°C. For optimal storage, aliquot target into smaller quantities after centrifugation and store at recommended temperature. For most favorable performance, avoid repeated handling and multiple freeze/thaw cycles.


## Scientific Background

Diacylglycerol kinase beta (DAG kinase beta) is a member of class I diacylglycerol kinase family and is regulated by Ca+ (1). Via converting diacylglycerol into phosphatidic acid, diacylglycerol kinases decrease the diacylglycerol levels to regulate the activity of PKC, Rho and Ras families (2). DGK beta is localized in brain and is involved in emotion and long-term memory linked to cognitive function (3). Impaired levels of diacylglycerol by DGK beta limits the NADPH oxidase activation in phagosomes (4).



## **Specific Activity**



The specific activity of DGKB (11-E) was determined to be **15** nmol /min/mg as per activity assay protocol.



The purity of DGKB (11-E) was determined to be >80% by densitometry, approx. MW 92kDa.

# Activity Assay Protocol

#### **Reaction Components**

Active Kinase (Catalog #: D22-11H)

Active DGKB ( $0.1\mu g/\mu l$ ) diluted with Kinase Dilution Buffer IX (Catalog #: K29-09) and assayed as outlined in sample activity plot. (Note: these are suggested working dilutions and it is recommended that the researcher perform a serial dilution of Active DGKB for optimal results).

Kinase Dilution Buffer IX (Catalog #: K29-09)

Kinase Assay Buffer III (Catalog #: K03-09) diluted at a 1:4 ratio (5X dilution) with cold water. Add freshly  $50\mu$ M DTT to the aliquot prior to use.

Kinase Assay Buffer III (Catalog #: K03-09)

Buffer components: 200mM Tris-HCl, pH 7.4, 100mM MgCl\_ and 0.5 mg/ml BSA.

#### ADP-Glo™ Kinase Assay Kit (Promega, Cat # V9101)

ATP solution, 10 mM ADP solution, 10 mM ADP-Glo<sup>TM</sup> Reagent Kinase Detection Reagent

#### 250 µM ATP Assay Solution

Prepare the ATP assay solution by diluting ATP solution, 10 mM (Promega, Cat # V9101) to 250  $\mu$ M in Kinase Dilution Buffer IX (Catalog #: K29-09).

DLG Substrate (Catalog #: D430-59)

The DLG substrate solution contains 10 mM of Dilauroyl-snglycerol in 100% DMSO solution. Dilute the substrate solution to 100  $\mu$ M in Lipid Dilution Buffer (Catalog #: L21-09) prior to use.

#### **PS Substrate**

The PS substrate solution contains 2mM of phosphatidylserine in Lipid Dilution Buffer (Catalog # L21-09).

#### **Assay Protocol**

The DGKB assay is performed using the ADP-Glo<sup>™</sup> Kinase Assay kit (Promega; Cat# V9101) which quantifies the amount of ADP produced by the DGKB reaction. The ADP- Glo<sup>™</sup> Reagent is added to terminate the kinase reaction and to deplete the remaining ATP, and then the Kinase Detection Reagent is added to convert ADP to ATP and to measure the newly synthesized ATP using luciferase/luciferin reaction.

- Step 1. Thaw the Active DGKB, Kinase Assay Buffer, Substrate and Kinase Dilution Buffer on ice.
- Step 2. In a pre-cooled 96-well opaque plate, add the following reaction components bringing the initial reaction volume up to 20μl:
  - Component 1. 10µl of diluted Active DGKB (Catalog #D22-11H).

**Component 2.** 5µl of 100 µM DLG and 2mM PS substrate solution.

**Component 3.** 5µl Kinase Dilution Buffer IX with final 2mM CaCl<sub>2</sub> and 0.1% Triton X-100

- Step 3. Set up the blank control as outlined in step 3, excluding the addition of the substrate. Replace the substrate with an equal volume of Kinase Dilution Buffer IX.
- Step 4. Initiate the reaction by the addition of 5µl of 250 µM ATP Assay Solution thereby bringing the final volume up to 25µl. Shake the reaction mixture in the 96-well opaque plate for 2 minutes and continue the incubation at 30°C for 40 minutes.
- Step 5. After the 40 minute incubation period, terminate the reaction and deplete the remaining ATP by adding 25µl of ADP-Glo™ Reagent. Shake the 96-well plate and then incubate the reaction mixture for another 40 minutes at ambient temperature.
- Step 6. Then add 50µl of the Kinase Detection Reagent to the 96-well plate and incubate the reaction mixture for another 30 minutes at ambient temperature.
- Step 7. Read the 96-well reaction plate using the KinaseGlo Luminescence Protocol on a GloMax plate reader (Promega; Cat# E7031).
- Step 8. Determine the corrected activity (RLU) by removing the blank control value (see Step 3) for each sample and calculate the kinase specific activity as outlined below.

#### Calculation of Specific Activity of ADP (RLU/pmol)

From ADP standard curve, determine RLU/pmol of ADP

### Kinase Specific Activity (SA) (pmol/min/µg or nmol/min/mg)

Corrected RLU from reaction / [(SA of ADP in RLU/pmol)\*(Reaction time in min)\*(Enzyme amount in µg or mg)
